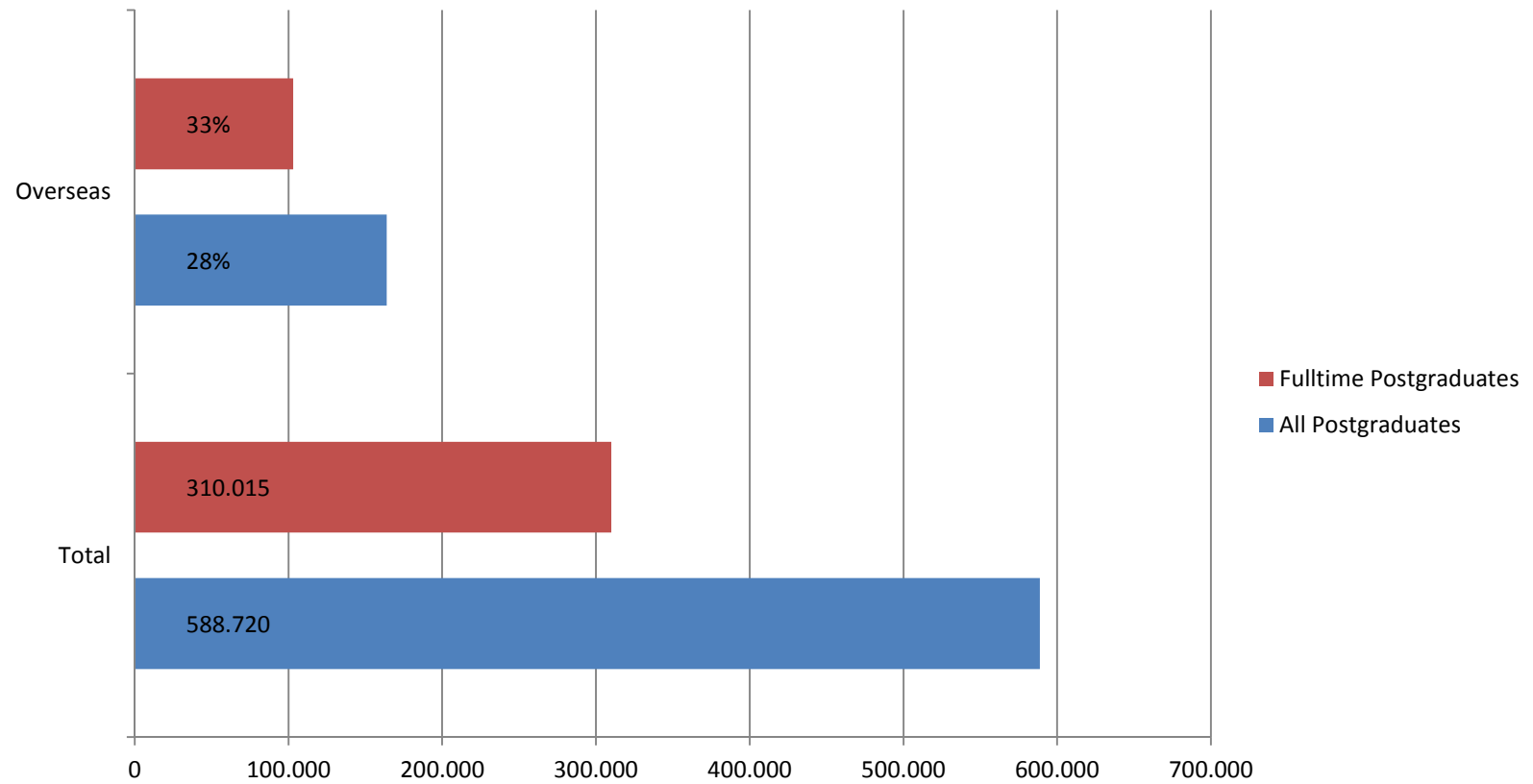


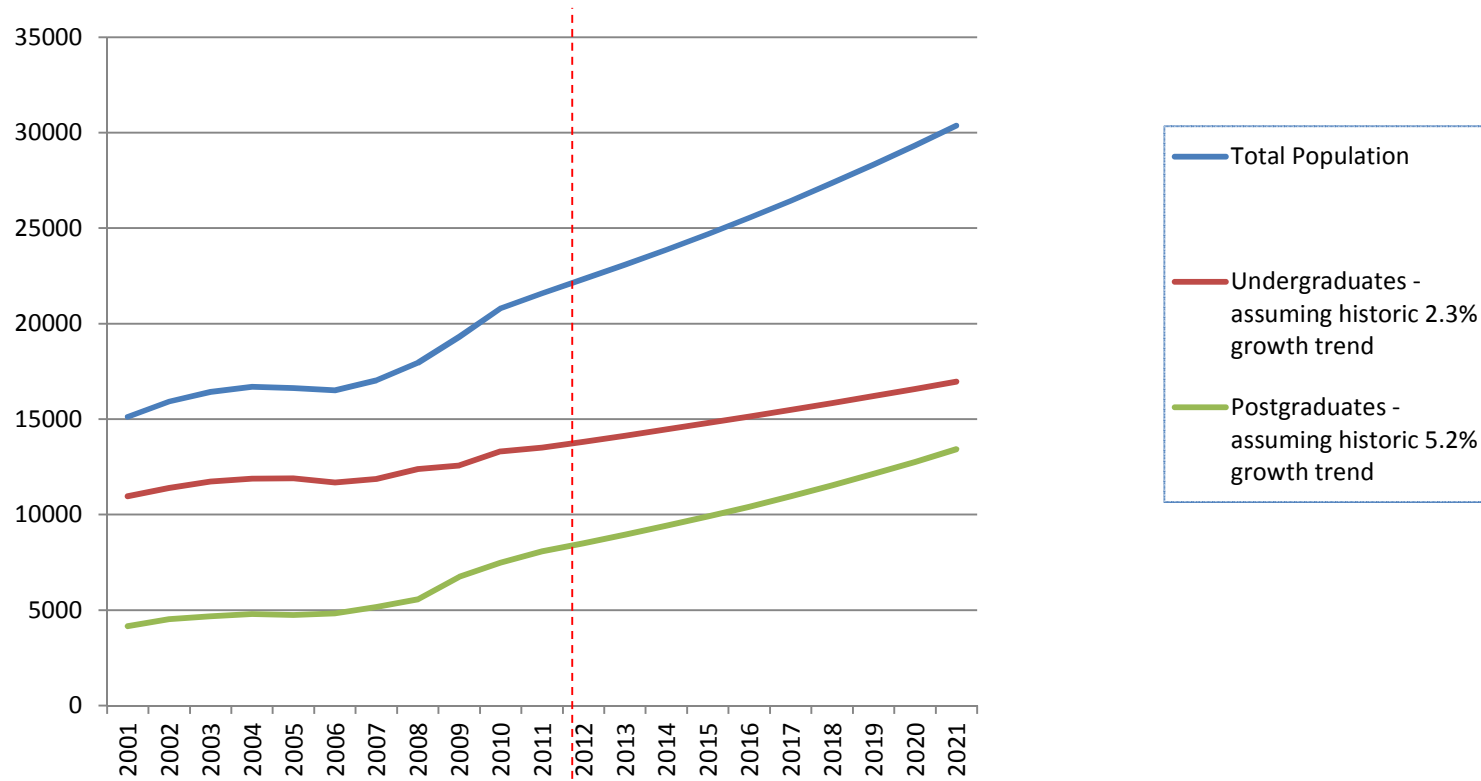

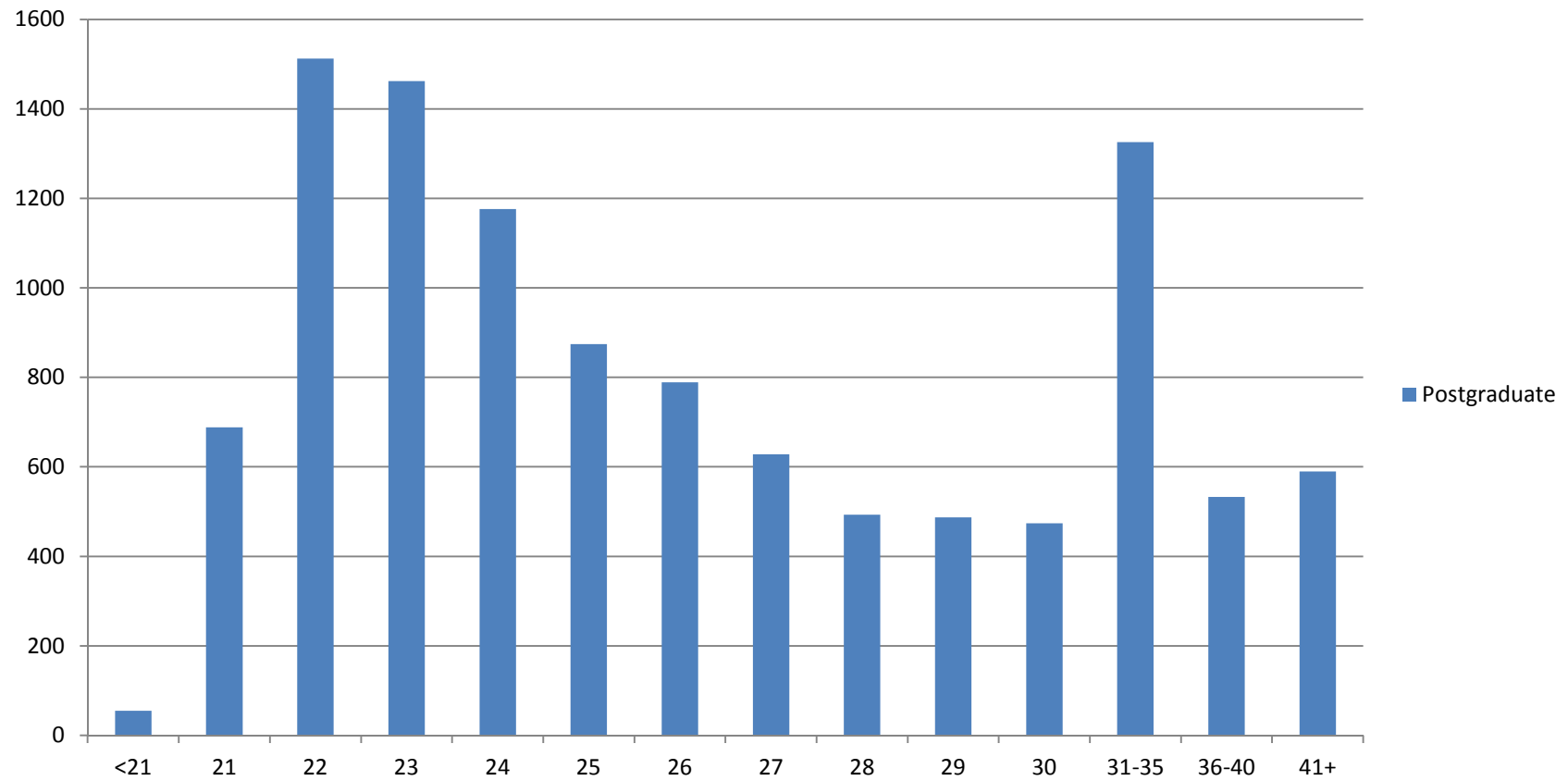


Current and Projected Fulltime Student Numbers at UCL



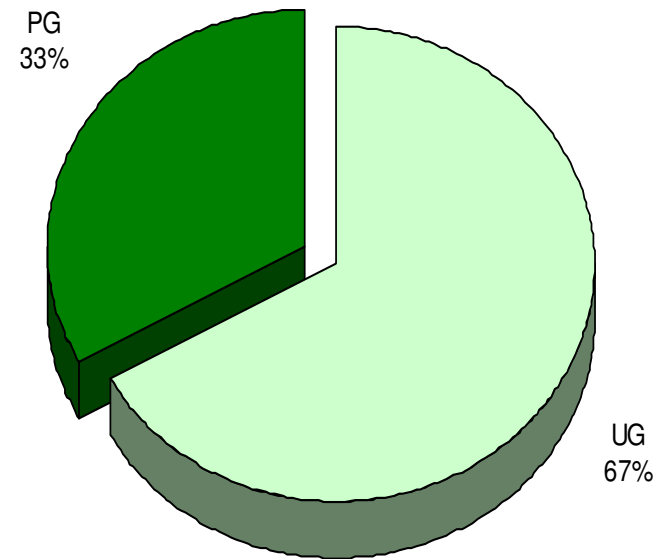
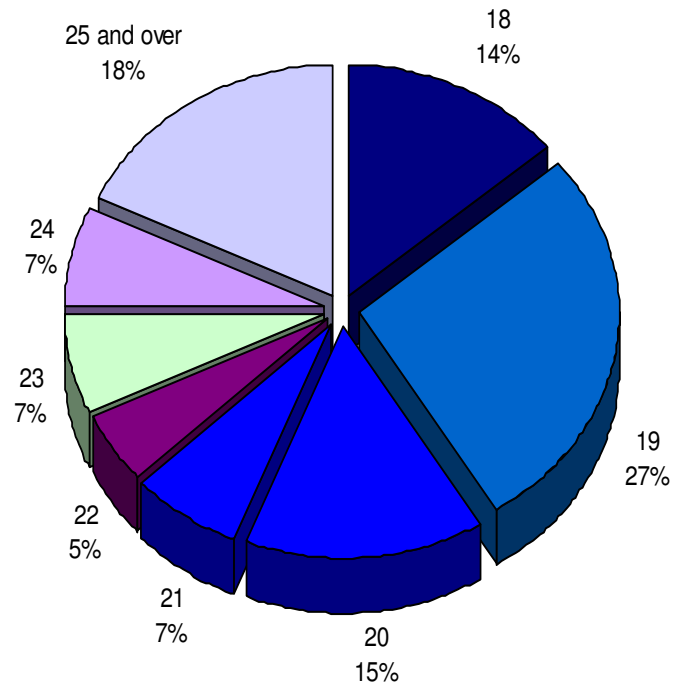


Postgraduate Student Numbers by Age at Date of Registration



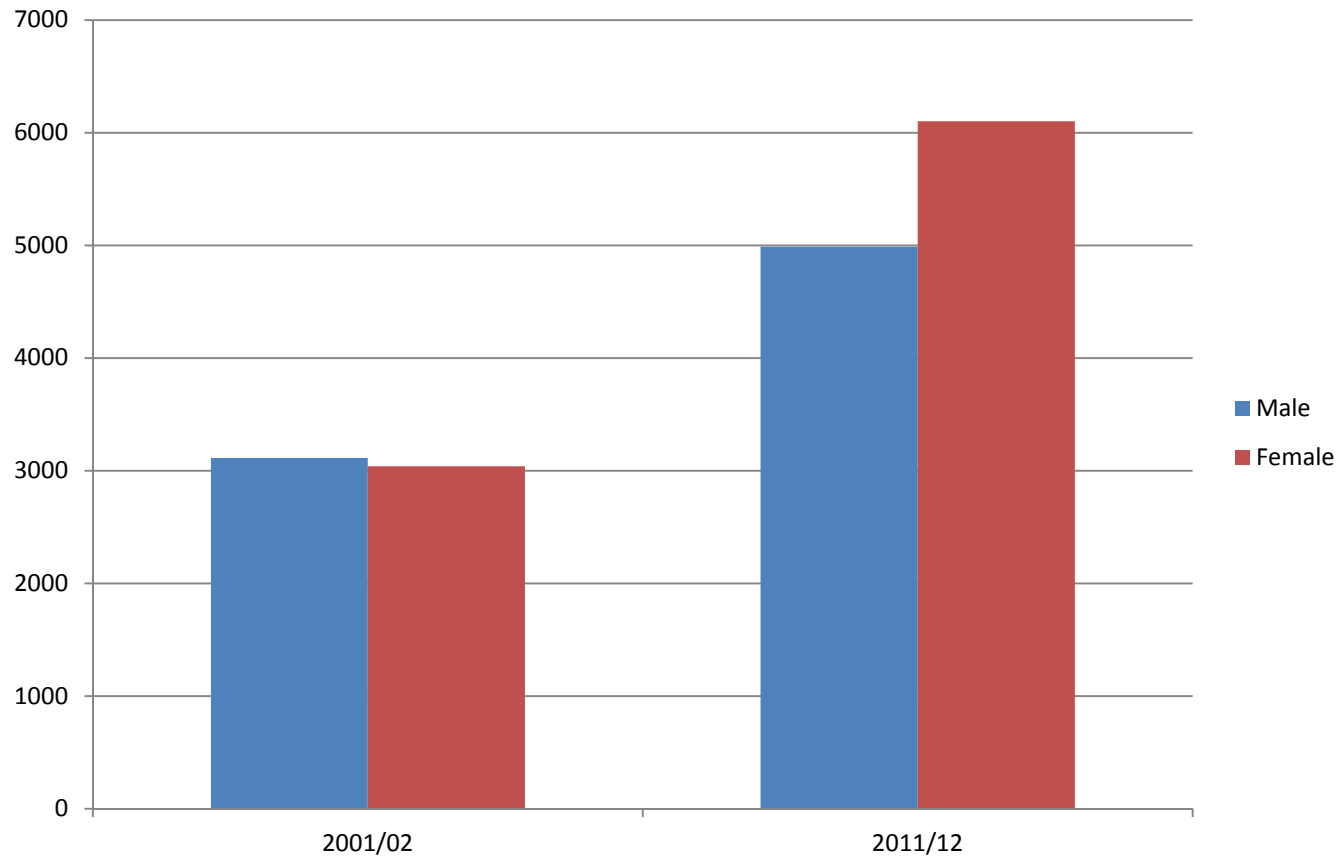


Age Profile in University of London Intercollegiate Halls



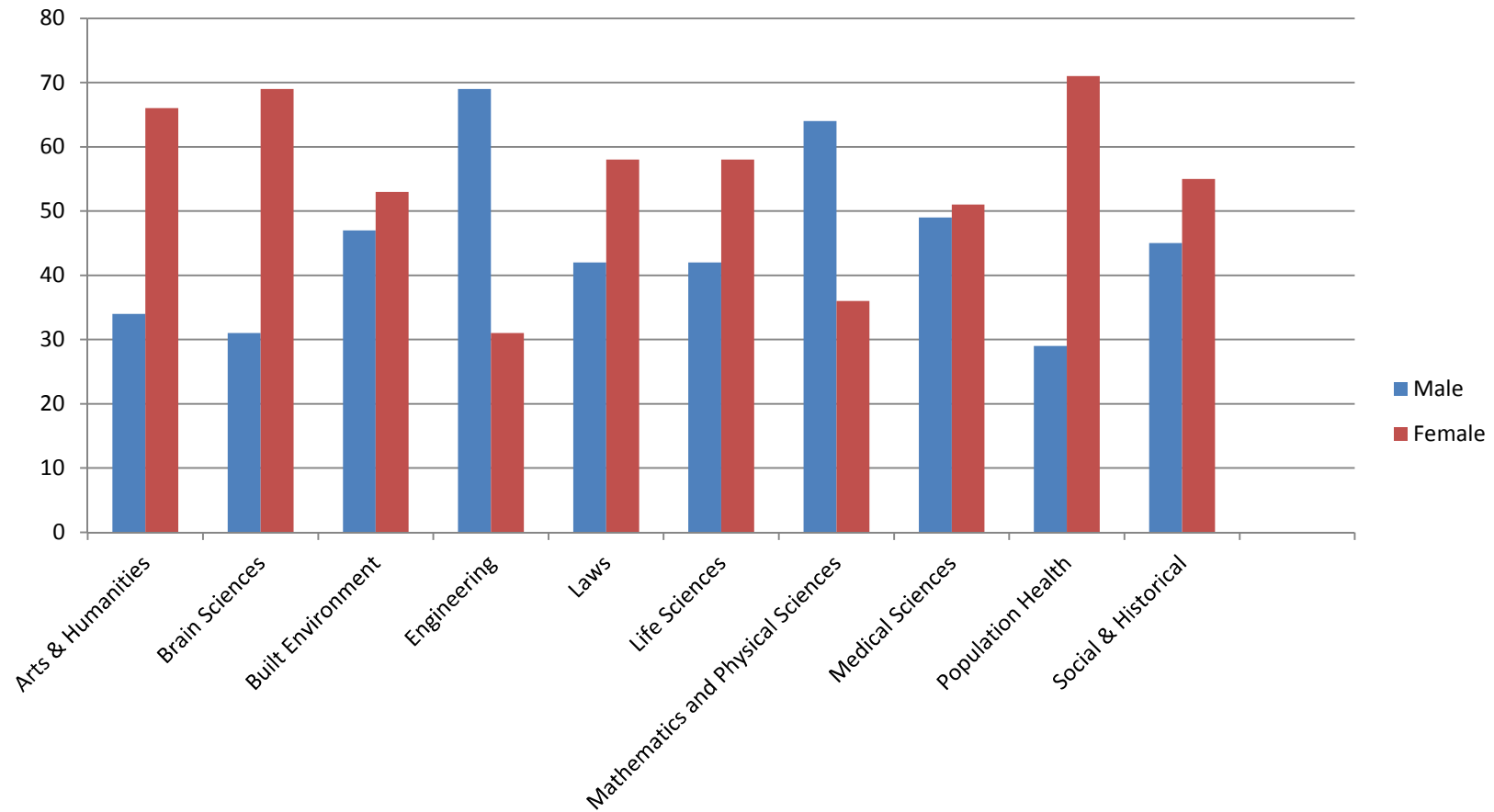


Postgraduate Student Numbers – 10 year Gender Trend





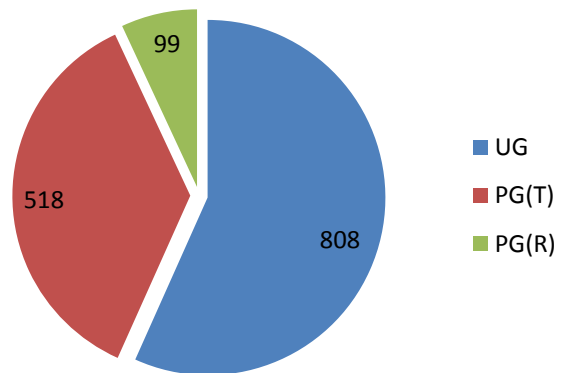
% Gender Breakdown by Faculty



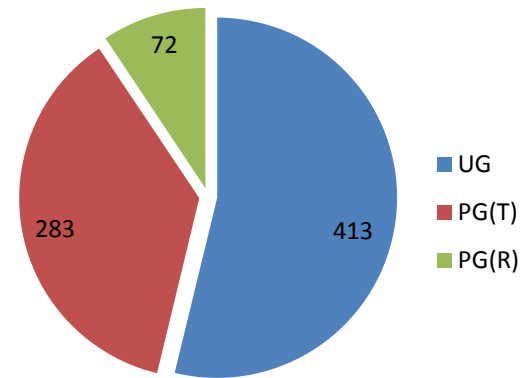

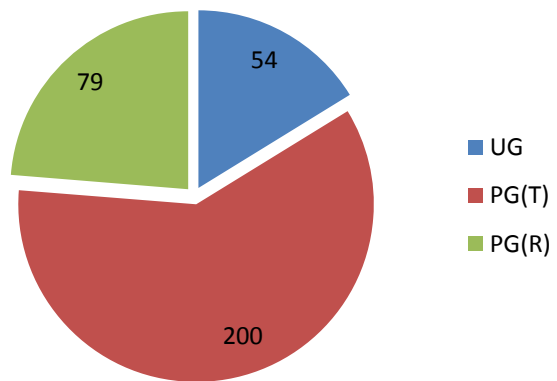

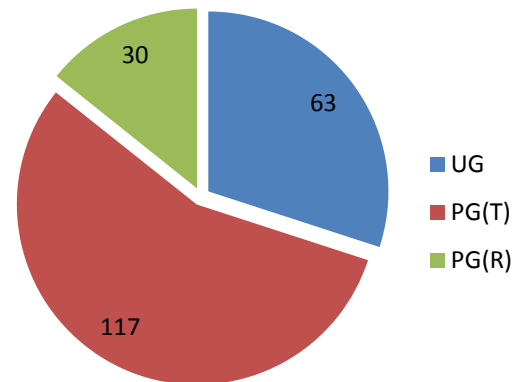


Breakdown by Country of Origin

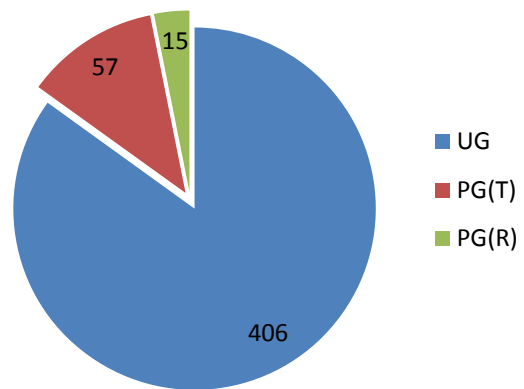

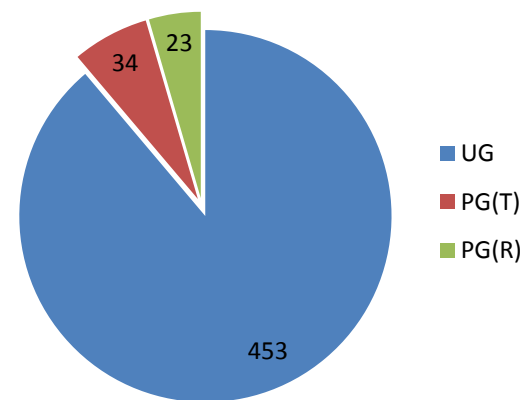

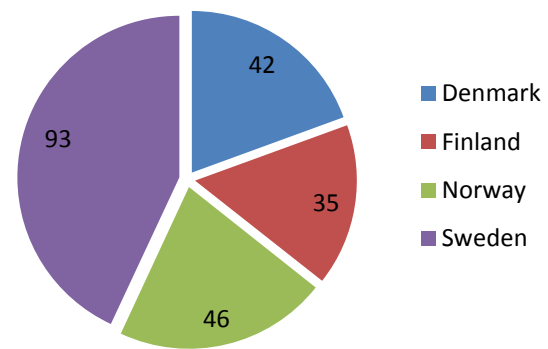

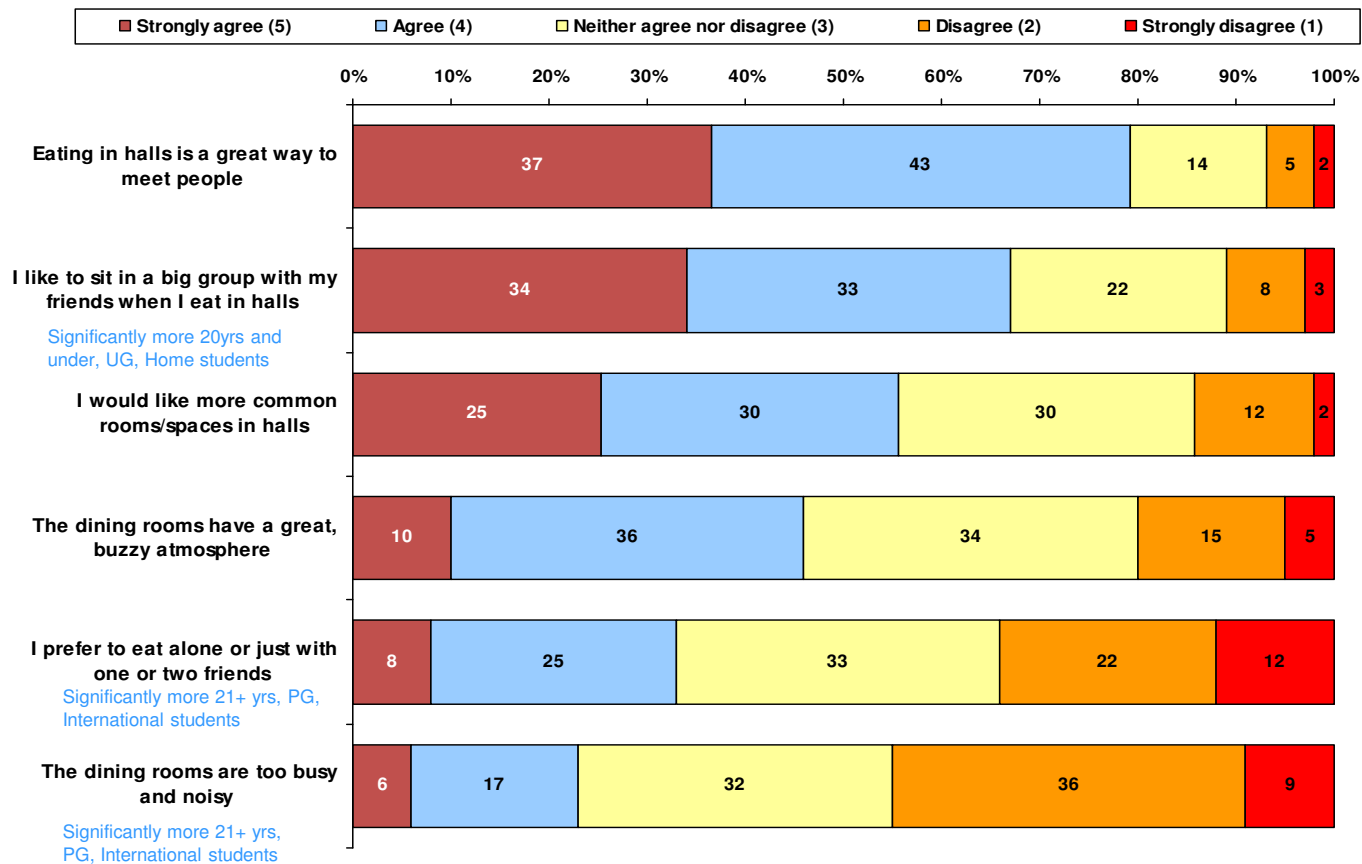

Students' Attitudes to Communal Catering



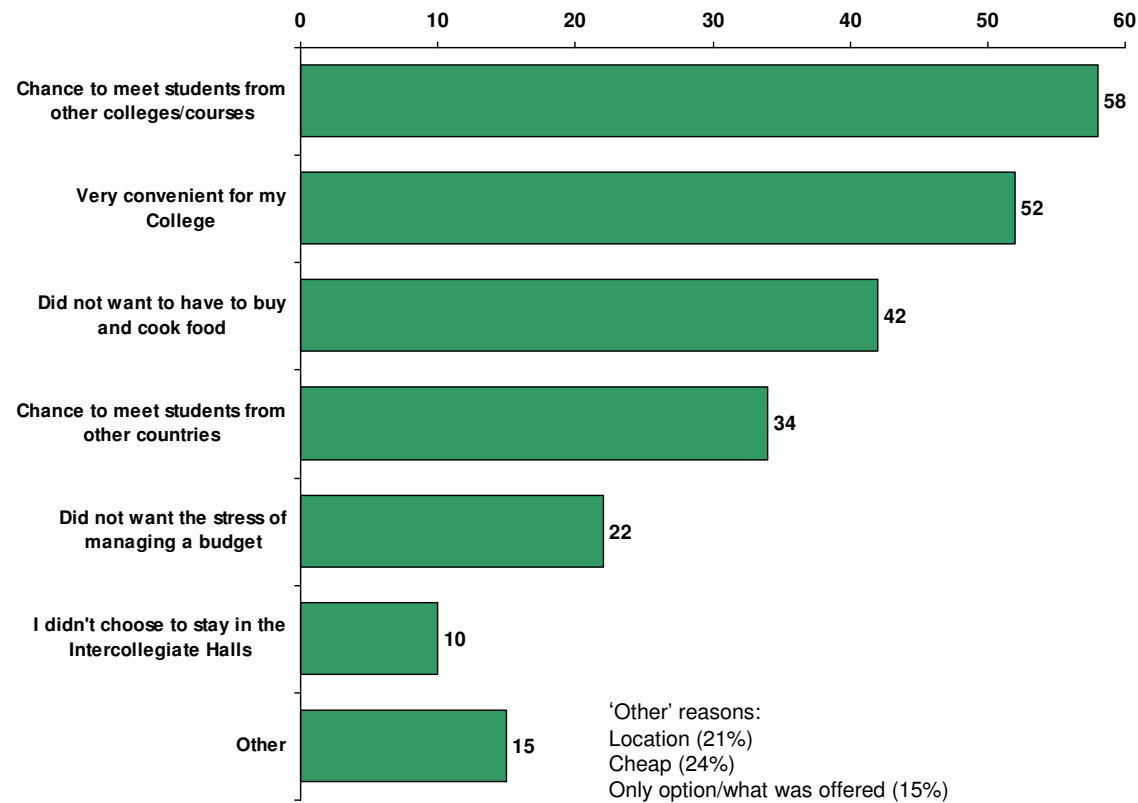
Respondents enjoy eating in halls and see it as a way to socialise with friends and meet new people.

Undergraduates, home students and those under 20 see this as especially important. They like the buzz and atmosphere, the large group tables and are also more likely to want access to additional social spaces in halls - this is especially important to males.

Post graduate, older students and international students are less concerned with the social aspects and can find the halls noisy and the group tables too large.



Reasons for Choosing UoL Intercollegiate Halls



Only 10% of respondents said they had not chosen to stay in the IH.

Respondents choose the halls predominantly for the chance to meet students from other colleges/courses and for their location although inclusive catering is still important.

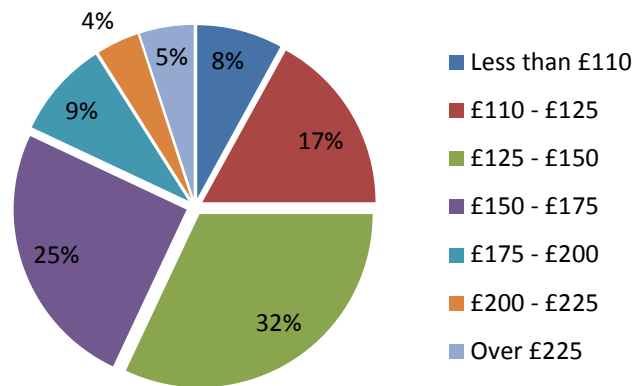
Motivations for males, undergraduates and respondents aged 20 and under are significantly more linked with not having to buy and cook food.

Significantly more international students are interested in meeting students from other countries.

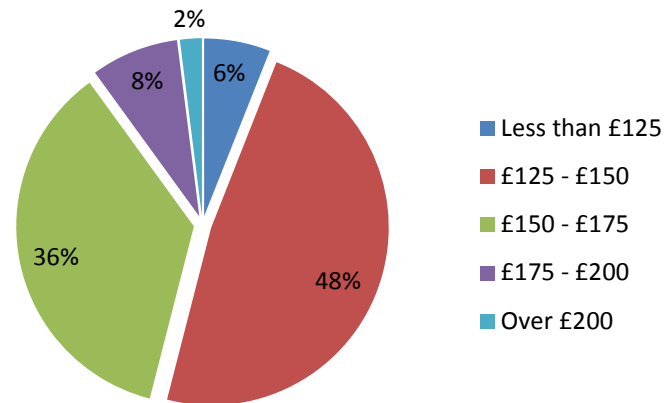


Rent Paid in the Private Rented Sector

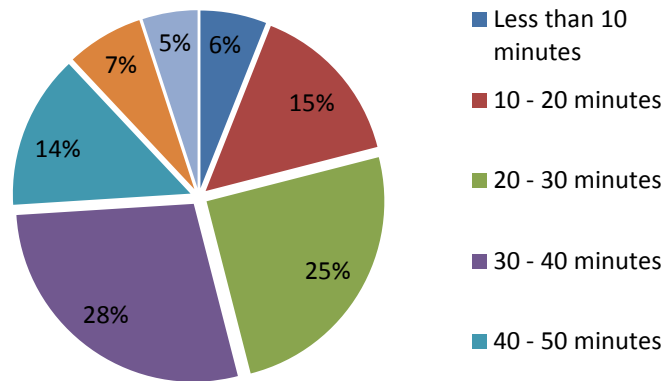

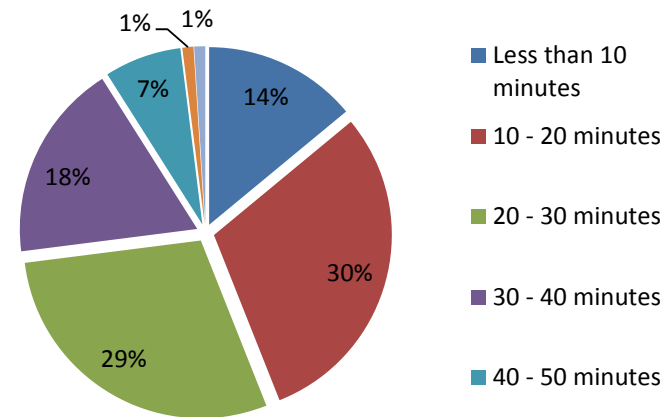


Acceptable Travelling Times in Private Rented Sector
